## Strengthening Our Communities

I grew up in a small suburban town south of Kansas City, Kansas. I'm the second generation in my family not to farm or live in a rural environment. Some of my great aunts and uncles were still living and working their family farms though. Summer days on the farm were some of the best. It didn't matter that it was 90% humidity and 104 degrees in the shade. Sitting on the back of a cultivator behind the tractor, knocking dirt clods off the leaves of struggling plants, was the only thing I wanted to do. Even though I grew up in suburbia, where the expectations were often to go to college and build a professional career, part of me always hoped I'd be able to find that sense of place again. And life happened.

About twenty years after those summers, I was working for a software company installing software on computers in the Public Trustees offices of most of the counties in Colorado. I drove from Denver to the farthest corners of the state, and in the process was reminded how much I love the land and landscape. When you live near a city, it's easy to forget that much of Colorado is beautifully rural. That job came and went, and I found myself back in a more urban routine. I still got the occasional motorcycle run through the country or a road trip to Kansas City or South Dakota, but not much more than that.

When I was asked if I would be interested in serving as a Grand Lodge Officer, I was warned that there was a lot of travel. The joke I had heard was that serving in the Grand Line would personally cost you \$100,000.00, two cars, and your wife... That had better be a joke, right? The travel expectation is not a joke—but what a blessing it has turned out to be. Heidi and I are reminded on every drive what a beautiful state we live in, how diverse the landscape is, and how that same diversity is reflected in the people and our brothers across Colorado.

One of the amazing things about smaller or more close-knit communities is that everything feels amplified—the good and the bad. When someone ends up in the paper for breaking the law, it's not just some anonymous story; it's often someone who's part of the community, someone who may have hit hard times and didn't know where to turn. And when a local volunteer firefighter rescues someone's animals or stops a brush fire, that's the same person you'll see that weekend at the café

having pie and coffee before heading to the auction. This really hit home while I was sitting in the county offices in Yuma twenty years ago, seeing that the front-page story was about the local football team's big win that Friday. How great is that—the headline news was celebrating local students.

On March 27th, Mount Moriah Lodge No. 15 sponsored not one, but two cornerstone ceremonies at their elementary schools. When I looked up the event in Canon City, Colorado, the local newspaper had an article highlighting the ceremony. The local ROTC color guard presented the flags of our country and state. Several students attended and represented their classmates who couldn't make it, while the superintendent championed the event. The brothers of Mount Moriah Lodge have a wonderful opportunity to strengthen their community—and they've embraced it.

I've spent a lot of time thinking about how all our lodges might create that kind of impact. If we consider that lodges operate within fairly small geographic areas—even in cities—there's great potential to look closer to home. If the average population of a rural town is about 2,500 people, in a city like Denver, that might translate to roughly half a square mile. If lodges focused not on the whole city but on their surrounding neighborhoods, could they make just as meaningful an impact as Mount Moriah No. 15, Ramah Lodge No. 165, Fruita Masonic Lodge No. 120, Pagosa Lodge No. 114, or Douglas Lodge No. 153?

Our forefathers established lodges close to where they lived and worked. They didn't travel 30 miles to attend meetings; they served right where they were, knowing who needed help and how they could lend a hand. We don't need to limit ourselves to such a narrow radius, but maybe we can benefit from the same idea—focusing our energy where it can do the most good. Remember using a lens to focus sunlight and burn a leaf as a kid? If you held the lens too far away, the energy was warm but diffuse. When you brought it close and focused the light into one small spot, incredible things happened.

I see that same kind of magic in small towns and in every community that knows how to focus on what truly matters. There are amazing opportunities all around us if we stay connected to our roots—both as a society and as Masons—and put our focus on the people and places right in front of us.

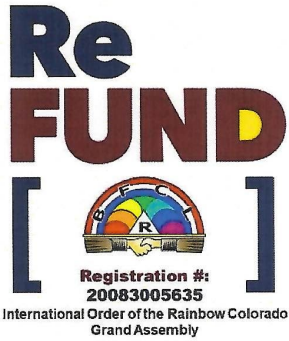

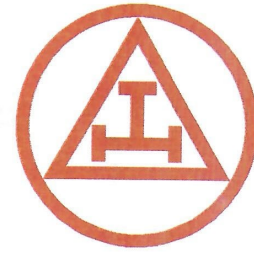

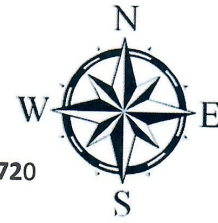

➤ **From Brush and Points West**

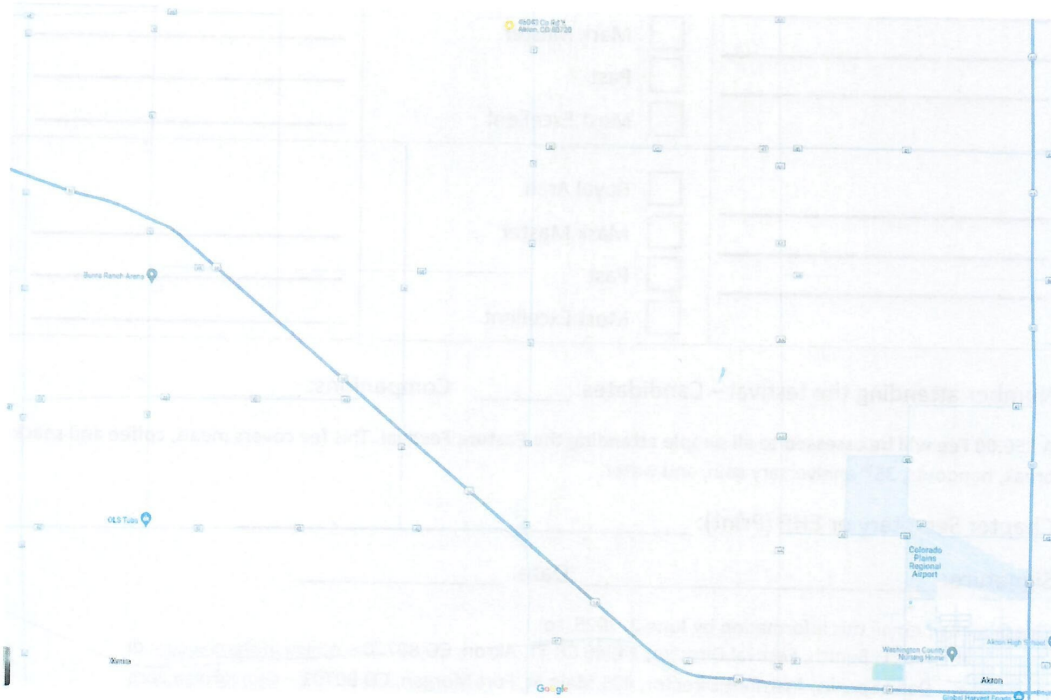
From I-76 use Exit 92, Turn right onto HWY 6 for about a mile and then left on HWY 34, go about 18 miles on HWY 34 east, look for an old feedlot on the North side of the road. Turn North on County Road Y, it is about 4.5 miles to the P / Lazy E Ranch. Turn West into the ranch.

➤ **From Akron and Points East**

Proceed West on HWY 34 four miles to the old feedlot on the North side of the highway. Turn right onto County Road Y and then 4.5 miles to the Ranch.

➤ **From Sterling and Points North**

Take the Atwood Exit from I-76 and proceed South on HWY 63 for about 15 miles. Turn West on Road 50. It's about 4 miles to Road Y, then proceed South about 4 more miles to the Ranch.
