## Financial Responsibilities of Lodges

First, I would like to take a moment to recognize and celebrate MWB Jerry Fenimore’s dedication to the Grand Lodge through his remarkable service as Grand Treasurer for 30 years. That is an extraordinary accomplishment and one that will likely remain unmatched for many years to come.

It is also my duty to remind the lodges of an important requirement contained in Paragraph 68.E. of the Book of Constitutions, which states:

“Each Lodge shall forward to the Grand Secretary, by June 15th of each year, a copy of any required tax return that has been filed with the Internal Revenue Service, during the present or previous calendar year for any and all entities in which the Lodge has a financial interest or responsibility.”

This requirement is not intended to be overbearing or punitive, but rather to reinforce the importance of maintaining proper financial records and complying with all applicable reporting obligations. Strong financial practices are essential to preserving our lodges for both our current members and future generations of Masons.

The annual filing of IRS Form 990 is far more than a routine administrative task. It demonstrates transparency, confirms compliance with federal regulations, and helps protect an organization’s tax-exempt status. Failure to file for three consecutive years results in the automatic revocation of nonprofit status by the Internal Revenue Service, creating significant challenges for lodges and affiliated bodies.

For smaller nonprofit organizations such as our lodges, filing the Form 990 is often a relatively simple process. However, once nonprofit status has been revoked, reinstatement becomes far more complex, time-consuming, and costly. Unfortunately, several lodges across the jurisdiction have experienced issues related to lapses in filing requirements.



## Financial Responsibilities of Lodges (cont.)

In response, a committee has been actively working with affected lodges to assist in reinstating their nonprofit status and guiding them back into compliance. Their efforts have been instrumental in helping lodges recover and move forward successfully, and they deserve recognition for their dedication to the Craft.

Beyond compliance, proper recordkeeping provides lodges with an opportunity to review financial operations, strengthen internal controls, and ensure lodge resources are being used wisely and effectively.

I encourage lodge officers, trustees, and finance committees to work closely together throughout the year—not just at reporting time—to maintain organized records and ensure all obligations are met in a timely manner. Preventive diligence is always far easier than corrective action.

Freemasonry has always taught us to leave things better than we found them. Financial responsibility is one more way we fulfill that obligation to the Craft and to each other.

## 2026 Matching Grants for Lodge Scholarships

Colorado Masons and their lodges have enjoyed great success with the Matching Grant program for many years. Students from all over Colorado have had financial assistance from their local lodges participating in Matching Grants. The Board of the Benevolent Fund sincerely appreciates the support shown by the lodges and is most pleased to continue the Matching Grant program.

The Matching Grants for 2026 will be up to \$500.00. To qualify for the full \$500 match, the Lodge would need to award an educational grant to a 2026 public high school graduating senior who will attend a Colorado institution of higher education. If the Lodge gives a total of \$1,000.00 or more to their chosen student, the match would be for half that amount, or \$500. If a lodge gives less than \$1,000, the match would be for half of the amount of the lodge grant. It is highly recommended that the Lodge checks be made out to the school or to the student AND the school.

One change in the Matching Grant program retained from last year is that a lodge can give a scholarship to more than one student in their area and apply for a match for each scholarship granted.

The deadline for requesting the matching grant is June 30, 2025. The form should be returned by email to: [education@cmbfa.org](mailto:education@cmbfa.org), or by snail mail to Scholarship Administrator, PO Box 703, Westminster, CO. If using regular mail, it must be postmarked by June 30, 2025 and received by July 8th. Checks will be distributed to Lodges the end of June or end of July depending on when the request forms are received and logged in.

➤ **From Brush and Points West**

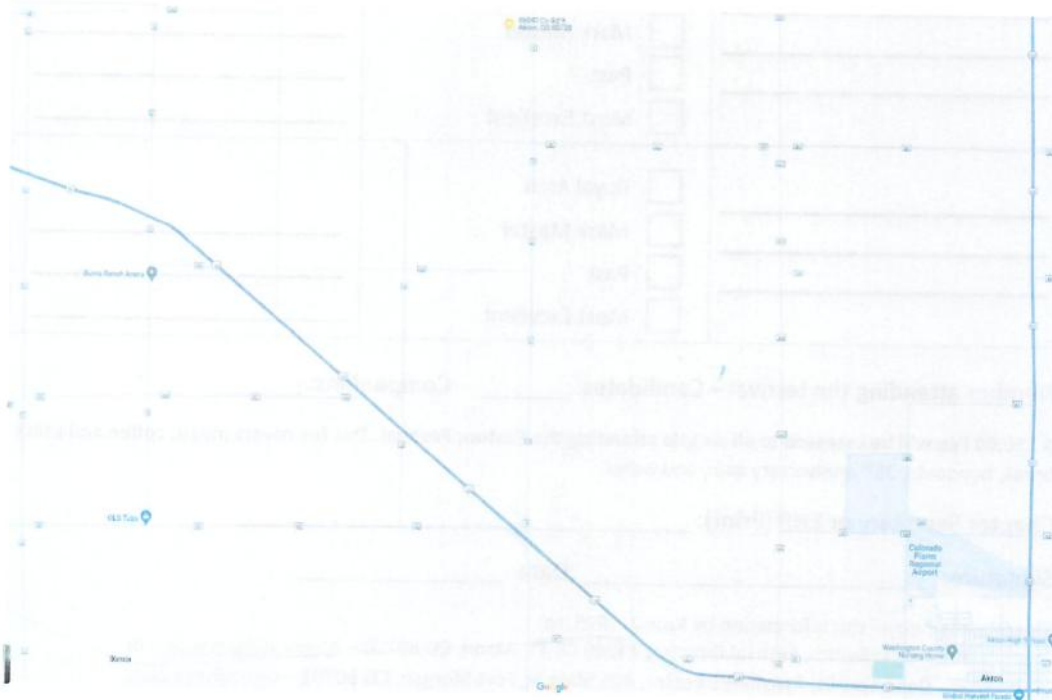
From I-76 use Exit 92, Turn right onto HWY 6 for about a mile and then left on HWY 34, go about 18 miles on HWY 34 east, look for an old feedlot on the North side of the road. Turn North on County Road Y, it is about 4.5 miles to the P / Lazy E Ranch. Turn West into the ranch.

➤ **From Akron and Points East**

Proceed West on HWY 34 four miles to the old feedlot on the North side of the highway. Turn right onto County Road Y and then 4.5 miles to the Ranch.

➤ **From Sterling and Points North**

Take the Atwood Exit from I-76 and proceed South on HWY 63 for about 15 miles. Turn West on Road 50. It's about 4 miles to Road Y, then proceed South about 4 more miles to the Ranch.



## Celebrating Kokomo Night

Grand Master William Marshal and four of his Grand Officers were guests of Corinthian Lodge #35 in Leadville on June 19th to celebrate Kokomo Night. This annual celebration fulfills our bylaws, which state, "Kokomo Night shall be the 3rd Thursday in June." It is held in the historic Kokomo room in the Corinthian #35 Lodge building in Leadville.

Corinthian 42 was chartered in September 1881 at Kokomo, Colorado, and affiliated with Leadville #35 in 1966, becoming Corinthian Lodge #35. Kokomo was a mining town located on Fremont Pass. Currently, a stone monument along Highway 91 marks the town's location.

Most notable are the artifacts and furniture of the Kokomo room, which is a replica of the original Kokomo Lodge. And it is the same today as it was in the Kokomo Lodge in 1882.

The Kokomo brethren wanted (and could afford) the best quality in everything about their lodge. The Wardens' chairs are ornate American Elm, with leather seats. The lights are Tiffany-style lamps that were originally kerosene and have been converted to electricity. The officer's jewels are sterling silver and are engraved on both sides. A faithful brother, Charles Rich, served as Worshipful Master for 23 years during a "bust" period in the mining industry. He is buried in the Leadville Masonic Cemetery.

The Kokomo brethren loved music. The lodge had a pump organ for its ceremonies, and later a Victrola with 78-rpm records was used. A story that always shows the strength and ingenuity of Masons is the charter story. It was no secret that Kokomo (Corinthian #42) had not met for several years. Consequently, the Grand Master planned to travel to Kokomo on the train and arrest the charter.

The railroad agent where he bought his ticket was a Mason and learned of the purpose of the visit. He telegraphed ahead, and surrounding lodges were notified.

When the Grand Master left the train in Kokomo, he was greeted by a lodge full of brethren and a banquet in progress. The Master did not arrest the charter that hangs on the wall by the secretary's desk. A picture of Kokomo and Corinthian Lodge #42 hangs in the Lodge, but most importantly, the matched nickel cuspidors are still fully functional.

So, mark your calendars for the 3rd Thursday in June 2026, and join Corinthian #35 and the Grand Officers for oyster stew on Kokomo night!!!
